Literacy News

This term our big focus is on speech writing. The children will have an opportunity to present their speech using a 'Ted Talk' style. We are lucky enough to have some input from Albany Senior High School students.

Reading

There is much more to being a good reader than just being able to read the words accurately. When children can read (or decode) texts with increased confidence, as many of our senior students can, the learning emphasis shifts towards developing a deep understanding of what they read, including making comparisons, judgements and forming opinions on the writing of others. Reading at home will strengthen comprehension and build vocabulary skills. These tips might help students and parents with reading outside of school:

• Aim to visit a local library at least once a term or during the holidays to increase the variety of books available to your family.

• Comparing opinions about articles in newspapers or magazines is a good place to begin, especially if your time is limited.

Mathematics

This term the Year 5 and 6 classes will continue to cross group for maths three days a week. The teachers will continue working together to ensure that we provide a carefully targeted maths programme. The students will also take part in maths teaching in their own classrooms.
