

Treaty of Waitangi Policy

Rationale

The Treaty of Waitangi is the founding document of our nation. It provides a framework for partnership today and in the future. Our school accepts its responsibility for attempting to fulfill the intent of the Treaty.

Purpose

- 1. To ensure the curriculum reflects Maori perspective.
- 2. To make equitable provision for the needs of Maori.
- 3. To provide opportunities for students who wish to learn Maori language and culture.
- 4. To recognize Maori values in resourcing the school.

Guidelines

- 1. Curriculum planning will ensure Maori perspective is embodied in the content, methodology and assessment.
- 2. Teaching strategies will incorporate Maori examples.
- 3. Opportunities will be provided for all students to learn tikanga Maori.
- 4. Students will have access to the school's bilingual and immersion programmes, (if applicable).
- 5. Pastoral care is provided through culturally appropriate ways.
- 6. Maori values and customs will be incorporated into school life.
- 7. Budgeting will reflect the need to implement the Treaty.
