<u>Curriculum</u>



<u>Literacy</u>

It is essential for young children to develop a sight vocabulary (a bank of words they recognise automatically). When children see writing modelled at home, or at school, and when they write themselves, they consolidate their understanding of words and how they are put together.

Each child will continue to read daily, with specific teaching to encourage the use of reading strategies. The development of a sight vocabulary is a key factor in enabling beginning readers to improve. Please remember to regularly practise the Magic Sight Words at home. When children can recognise words immediately they are free to concentrate on reading for meaning.

The children are tested regularly to ensure their specific needs are met.

Please make sure that you have a chat with your classroom teacher if you have any questions or concerns.



<u>Maths</u>

In term three we will continue to focus on number knowledge and developing instant recall of basic facts. We will also build a range of addition, subtraction and multiplication strategies that children can use to solve number problems. Inquiry - How the World Works

Our Inquiry focus is Science this term. In Year 2 the children will be observing, describing and comparing the changes that occur when materials are mixed, heated or cooled. In week 3 the Year 2 classes will be visiting The Old Lolly Shop in Takapuna. We will observe the process of how lollipops are made the old fashioned way, all mixed and pulled by hand. Each child will receive a long piece of lollipop mixture to mould into their own creation (and of course eat).

The Year 1 children will be looking at the science behind floating and sinking. In week 3 the Year 1 classes will be visiting MOTAT where the flight educators are working our topic into their flight programme. We will have time to explore both the main MOTAT site and the MOTAT flight site. There will also be a tram ride and of course the educator session.

Health and PE

This term we have an engaging unit planned where students will learn movement, coordination and locomotor skills while doing a range of activities such as skipping, running and jumping. The children will also be taking part in Folk/cultural dancing.

Maori language

The Junior children will continue to learn Te Reo Maori, we will be learning several Maori myths and legends.
