Kia Ora,

Thank you for your support and understanding in moving our school back to level 3.

For these three days there will not be any home learning specifically provided. The children may, if you wish, use Mathletics or Reading eggs, through their usual passwords. If we get an indication that level 3 will last longer than the three days initially indicated, then we will adjust our plans for learning. Please keep an eye on your class Seesaw app, as further information will be distributed through this as well as via the school email.

Level 3

 The school is only open for those children of essential workers. Please ensure if you are in this category that you ring or email the office to ensure we have the correct number of teachers on site to look after the children.

School Routines at Level 3 (Only the children of essential workers)

- The children who have to be in school, as their parents are essential workers, will be placed back in a 'bubble'.
- You will receive an email later this morning specifying the classroom, the teachers of the bubble and entry and exit gates for your child to use, when we have the number of children of essential workers who need to be at school.
- We ask those parents to drop the children at the school gates and not come onsite.
- Please use Isobel Rd gate or the Sunnyview Rd bottom gate to drop your child. A member of staff will be there to ensure a safe transition into school.
- For the safety and health of the staff on duty and the other adults and children, observe social distancing.
- At this stage we won't be staggering the start and finish times for bubbles. However, this may change, but you will be informed.
- Please remind your child of the need to wash hands and practice good hygiene. If your child is sick, please keep them at home and if a child becomes unwell at school, they will be sent straight home.

While we have had very little time to enact our plans, we are lucky to have the most dedicated and caring staff at our school. If your child does need to be in school, to help you in your role as an essential worker, please be assured we will look after the health, safety and well being of your child. I see it as an important role of our school to support those essential workers in our community.
