Installing the CCTV cameras is certainly looking like a good decision as it has led to some leads for the police to investigate. Hopefully we will not have to use them again.

We have started the triage work to get the field usable, although with the season for grass growth now complete, the work to get the field fully back to where we were will be a long term project, as we need to be back into spring to see the growth that will bind everything properly back together. We are hopeful of allowing the kids back on once the initial work is completed.

The bottom gate will now be remaining locked at all times.
