## Senior School Newsletter Term 2 2021

#### Curriculum

#### <u>Inquiry</u>

This term our overarching theme for inquiry is 'Sharing the Planet'. It covers a very wide area including;

- our rights and responsibilities to have equal opportunities
- space exploration, future focus for humanity
- sun/shadows/ moon phases/tides/space exploration, water cycle, geography-landforms

Each year group and class will follow a different path depending on where the students want to take their study.

## Reading Strategies

Our primary teaching emphasis in Year 5 and 6 is on teaching reading strategies which help develop comprehension no matter what level a child is working at.

"Proficient readers are active readers. They actively engage with the text using a number of strategies to gain meaning from it. " (Cameron, 2009).

These strategies include: predicting, questioning, making connections, visualising, finding and summarising important ideas or information. Nine to eleven year olds still enjoy sharing their books with important adults in their lives. They should be encouraged to talk about how using one of their reading strategies can help overcome challenges they face with new texts. They also love to be read to and we encourage you to explore books together. Book talk of all kinds will continue to motivate children to read.

## **Writing**

It is in the senior school that our students begin to really show their new learning through writing. There are several things we are looking for in successful writing by the end of Year 6 including:

- writing for a range of audiences and purposes
- · a variety of sentence structures
- · precise vocabulary choices
- use a range of written features to engage the audience; e.g. metaphors similes and onomatopoeia
- a simple but effective overall text structure
- success in spelling of words on the seven essential word lists
- · paragraphs

These elements will be taught and practised in class daily. In writing lessons we will explore a variety of effective texts and use them as a basis for our own writing. Over the course of a week or over several weeks children may write stories, persuasive arguments, factual reports, instructions or recounts from a particular perspective.

#### **Mathematics**

There will be a big focus on basic facts, so along with number strategies, which is taught in learning groups, there will be a big push for children to be able to instantly recall basic facts. This includes addition and subtraction equations to 20, and times tables to 10. This can also be something that the children practise at home.

#### PE/Fitness

Students will be focusing on increasing their fitness through middle distance running. They will be monitoring their running efforts and trying to better each performance. This will culminate in the senior school cross country running event on Tuesday 1st June which will be held at Wainoni Park.

For Cross Country practise this year we will be training within the school grounds due to the amount of roadworks going on in Greenhithe.

We also have a specialist dance teacher coming in every Wednesday to teach our Y5&6 students a choreographed dance in preparation for our school production next term. This is a fabulous opportunity for our students. Part of our activity fee is used for this.

#### Y6 CAMP!

Just a reminder that the Year 6 classes are going to camp in week 8. The dates are Monday 21st - 23th June Y6 camp Rm 21 & 23 and Wednesday 23rd - 25th June Y6 camp Rm 22 & 24. A modified gear list will come out soon that will include some winter woollies for colder days (beanies, jumpers, gloves, jacket). Something to get excited about!

### **GENERAL HOUSEKEEPING**

#### **Before School**

Students are allowed into their classroom when the bell rings at 8:30am. Any students arriving before this time will need to wait at the school gates until they are opened. Teachers are busy and are not always in their classrooms to supervise your child before school. At 8.45am another bell will ring and this indicates for students to go to their classroom to prepare themselves for the day. It is a settling in time and an opportunity for students to talk to their classroom teacher.

## **Tissues**
