

UNIFORM POLICY

Rationale:

The wearing of a school uniform fosters pride and self-esteem in the children of Greenhithe School and achieves an identity for the school in the wider community.

Definition of the Uniform:

- The Board has approved the following uniform:
 Polo shirts, Polar fleece, Hat bucket style with brim, raincoat
- The lower half garments must be plain navy blue in colour. Jeans are not considered appropriate. The option is available to purchase selected designs for lower garments through the school.
- Footwear is not designated but we have a preference for dark coloured shoes or trainers. It should be appropriate to the activities being undertaken – no jandals or high heels. Covered footwear must be worn for all EOTC activities.
- Winter wear that is not a part of school uniform (thermal tops, scarves, gloves, hats) are not designated but we have a preference for dark coloured or Greenhithe specific items which should be worn appropriately for their intended purpose.
- Jewellery is to be appropriate to the activities undertaken in the curriculum and to the cultural sensitivities of individuals. The only jewellery to be worn is a wristwatch and stud earrings. The wearing of Taonga is acceptable. Children are not to wear make-up, nail polish or other stick - on embellishments, e.g. transfers or tattoos.

Purpose:

- To promote the culture of Greenhithe School
- To provide practical, all purpose school attire

Guidelines:

- 1. The wearing of school uniform is compulsory during school hours and whenever representing the school, and is to be in a clean and tidy presentation at all times.
- 2. Sports uniform must be worn when representing the school at sporting events, but not for everyday use.
- 3. All items must be clearly named.
- 4. Uniform is to be clean and worn in a tidy presentable manner.
- 5. Hats must be worn when children are outside during Terms 1 and 4.
- 6. Exceptions to the above may be granted at the discretion of the principal (culturally sensitive, medical bracelets etc).
