<u>Inquiry</u>

During Term 1 we will explore 'where we are in place and time' acknowledging the Treaty of Waitangi and cultural diversity. There will be a special focus of looking at places of significance in our local Greenhithe area. Students will be encouraged to take more responsibility for their learning, giving them skills to become lifelong learners. For example, they will learn to identify next steps in their own learning and share their understanding.

Reading

Students will be building on their reading comprehension skills; for example inferencing, finding information and critical thinking. The focus this term will be integrating reading with our inquiry. The students will attend differentiated sessions based on their individual needs. They will be expected to analyse what they read and make links between their prior knowledge and the new information learnt.

Writing

Students will produce a variety of texts based on what they are learning about throughout the curriculum. We have clear expectations and literacy learning goals that the students will work towards. Students will have opportunities for independent writing sessions and during this time they can write about matters that interest them.

Spelling

Students will be learning a range of strategies they can use when learning spelling words. They will also be participating in learning activities based around the knowledge of sounds and developing their vocabulary and grammar.

Mathematics

In the senior school, the focus is on using basic facts knowledge to solve problems across a range of mathematical areas. Our strand maths learning for this term will be based around 'position and orientation', time and statistics.

Bring Your Own Device (BYOD)

Year 5 and 6 students are being invited to bring in their own computer for classroom learning. We would like the students' to use their own device to deepen learning and to make learning more personalised and student-centered. This opportunity is an invitation, not an expectation, and we are not insisting that students purchase or bring a device. We are giving you the choice. Students will continue to complete regular book work alongside digital platforms. If mobile phones (or any other device that is used for texting or calling) are brought to school they will be collected and sent to the office before school. They will be returned to students just before 3pm.

Save the date for Year 5 trip to the Millenium

The dates are March 21st or 22nd. Students will be participating in a variety of activities such as kayaking, water safety, rock climbing, problem solving and team building challenges. Information about this will be sent out later in the term.

Save the date for our Y6 Camp!

Our Y6 camp will be held later in the year. The dates are November 8, 9 & 10. We will start sending out information later in the term about the new location and cost for camp.
