This week marks the end of another successful school term. And, as parents, you're probably wondering where the time went as the weeks flew by. For our staff, we're sure they are all looking forward to some time to relax, unwind and regroup once that bell rings at 3pm Friday. It's been another massive term, and as a board, as well as members of the community, we'd like to thank the Greenhithe staff for their effort and dedication to make this another successful term.

Providing balance is important to the vision of Greenhithe's education - and there was certainly something in term 3 for everyone. Between working around building works, school productions, school trips, mixed in with plenty of academic activity, students were presented with plenty of opportunities and new learning experiences throughout the term. Mid year results illustrate that students are experiencing success at above average rates in reading (84.4%), writing (76.6%) and maths (85.5%), but we're not resting there- and have plans to grow these results (nb: there's still half a year of excellent teaching still to be delivered).

As always, the board continues to be amazed with the spirit that our kaiako, ākonga and local whānau undertake new challenges to support our tāmariki. As the saying goes - it takes a village to raise a child, so much thanks also to the 'village' of Greenhithe.

By now you will be aware that there's an important upcoming election with notification out earlier in the week that there are mid-term parent elections for 3 board vacancies. The election process is being handled externally by CES on the school's behalf.

As outlined in the communication, the key dates to note are:

- Friday 22 September, 2023: Nomination papers issued to the community via email (or if no email via post)
- Wednesday 11 October, 2023: Nominations close
- Wednesday 15 November, 2023: Election day

As a board, we have the responsibility to ensure that all students at school are achieving. This extends to making sure that the principal/staff are supported and resourced to achieve high-quality teaching and learning to all learners within our community. It's an important role that deserves to have diverse voices and perspectives heard at the table. If you've ever wondered about joining the board, been curious about supporting the school's development, or questioned why things are done a certain way then reach out to a current board member to discuss, come along to a board meeting and observe or simply step up and nominate yourself on September 22.

Sure, there's another election that seems to be taking the limelight, but this one puts you in a position to make a direct positive impact on our kids' education.

Literacy Update

In August, the Board was presented with results and information regarding literacy achievement at Greenhithe. 86% of Greenhithe students are at or exceeding at the mid year assessment point, and our staff have set the target of growing this achievement to 93%. Literacy is a hot topic in the news media but early reporting indicates that Greenhithe students are performing well above national benchmarks.

At Greenhithe School we have been using a specific phonics programme with years 0-3 classes for the last four years. Yolanda Sorryl's Phonics Programme, uses the 'Science of Reading' that combines a structured approach to phonics while ensuring students have an understanding of *what* they are reading also. The board was presented with the results of recent phonics assessments which illustrate the success this programme is having.

Literacy continues to be an area of Professional Learning and Development for all staff with the school utilising MoE funding to engage Vision Education to provide expert support and guidance to enhance literacy practice. PLD focuses on best teaching practices, curriculum integration, and targeted interventions, such as Accelerated Learning Groups.

School Property Update
