What's on this term:

On Friday 25th July (week 2) we will be having our 100 days at school celebration. A letter will go home giving more details about this. Please remind your child to bring 100 (small) things to sort, and a plate of food on this date.

This term, our inquiry focus is Science and Technology, looking at *How the World Works*. The children will be learning about mini-beasts and what they need to survive, such as food, water, air, and shelter. We'll explore how different creatures are suited to their habitats and how they grow and change through their life cycles. We will also be teaching the *Keeping Ourselves Safe (KOS)* programme with support from the New Zealand Police. This programme helps children learn how to stay safe in a range of situations. There will be a parent information session in the term for those who would like to learn more about the programme.
