

Year 4/5 Newsletter Term 3, 2025

A warm welcome to everyone as we begin Term 3, especially to the new students and their families joining our school community—we're so glad to have you with us!

This term, our big question for Inquiry is: "How can science and technology help us create a better future?"

Students will explore how the world works through hands-on investigations into:

- Materials How they've become stronger, lighter, better?
- Energy Using sunlight, wind, and water as power.
- Weather & Climate What causes different weather patterns and climate change?
- Living world, Plants How do plants grow and how do humans use them?
- Forces & Motion What makes things move or stop?

We're learning how science can solve real-world problems and shape a smarter, more sustainable future!

Reading and Writing in Inquiry

This term, our reading and writing are closely linked to our science inquiry. Each Y4/5 teacher is selecting two reading texts that connect to the science experiments students are exploring—one for building confidence and one for more confident readers. For example, suppose a class is learning about friction, they will read related texts and practise skills like skimming and scanning, locating key information, interpreting diagrams and graphs, and identifying key ideas. These texts will be used for follow-up comprehension and writing tasks to deepen understanding. This approach helps students make strong connections between reading, writing, and science learning.

Maths

At Greenhithe, we aim to develop confident, capable mathematicians who can apply their learning to real-life situations. Our maths programme follows the New Zealand Curriculum and covers number, algebra, measurement, geometry, statistics, and probability. Lessons are hands-on, interactive, and focused on building deep understanding through problem-solving, discussion, and practical activities. We use the Oxford University Maths programme to support structured learning and reinforce key skills. Our goal is to spark curiosity, encourage mathematical thinking, and equip students with the tools they need to succeed.

Physical Education

This term, students will take part in fun activities like skipping, tag games, and Jump Jam to build their movement skills. They will be practising their dance for the school production, Dancing through the Decades, which helps improve coordination, balance, rhythm, and confidence. Alongside this, students will learn about teamwork, fair play, and how competition can affect our feelings. Through games like tennis and soccer, they'll practise using rules, playing safely, and working well with others.

We will also be teaching the **Keeping Ourselves Safe (KOS)** programme this term, with support from the New Zealand Police. This programme helps children learn how to keep themselves safe in a variety of situations. A parent information session will be held later in the term for those who would like to learn more.

Our school production, 'Dancing through the Decades', is scheduled for Week 8 and will involve all Year 3 to 6 classes. It promises to be a fun and exciting event!

Expectations

We expect students to read a book from the school library or a book of their own choice at home for 20 minutes, four times a week. Students can also practice their maths skills and times tables at home using the online 'Mathletics' programme. They may be assigned activities by their classroom teacher or can use the 'Live Mathletics' option to practice their basic facts.

We're looking forward to another fantastic term of learning and fun.
